Introduction to the Voter Guide

Church Voter Guides is an independent 508c1a faith-based nonprofit organization. We serve the public by providing objective research and education on matters specifically of interest to Christians, primarily through the production and distribution of 501c3-compliant, nonpartisan Voter Guides.

Church Voter Guides does not endorse or oppose any candidates for public office or any political party.

We are based in Colorado Springs, and the April 2021 City Council election in our hometown was our inaugural project, followed by Voter Guides for the 2021 Pikes Peak Region School Board Elections. Our new Voter Guide for the 2022 Colorado Primary Elections for Federal, Statewide, and El Paso County Offices is being distributed electronically-only through our website via downloadable and printable PDF files, as well as mobile-friendly interactive webpages. As this Voter Guide is for the Primary Election, there are separate Guides for the Republican and Democratic party candidates.

The purpose of our Voter Guides is to educate and inform voters of each candidate's positions on a variety of policy issues that they are likely to address if elected. As a Voter Guides designed to be promoted through Churches, we ask the candidates questions on topics that are of utmost interest to the Christian voter.

How to Get the Most Benefit from this Voter Guide

The core information in this Voter Guide comes directly from the candidates themselves. We asked them questions, they answered (with a 120 word limit), and we have published their responses here verbatim. In order to understand and utilize this information to the fullest, so that you may vote in the most informed way, we suggest the following:

1. Pray and ask the Almighty for discernment. The Kingdom of God is all about truth, while politics is a system fraught with compromise. Make sure you consider the candidates' answers with a Heavenly mindset.
2. Ask yourself, "Did the candidate actually answer the question, or rather side-step it, or give a fluff, wishy-washy, and/or 'political' type answer that leaves you not really knowing where he/she truly stands on the issue?"
3. Learn more about the candidates, including their positions on issues we did not cover in our Questionnaire, by visiting their official campaign websites. The website URL for each candidate is listed in the Voter Guide, if they have one.
4. Use search engines to find additional information about each candidate, including written articles and videos, other voter guides, and even voting records for those who have served in public office before. You may even want to watch online recordings of governmental meetings, as well as events held by candidates and organizations, to learn more about each candidate.
5. Reach out to the candidates themselves through the provided email addresses and other means, in order to ask them questions of personal importance to you. Please make sure to show great respect toward each candidate and his/her time, especially to those with whom you disagree. Running for office is hard, stressful, time-consuming work, and these are your fellow citizens who have lives, families, jobs...and feelings (just like you!)

What makes a Voter Guide 501c3 - compliant and Nonpartisan?

Federal tax law permits nonprofit 501c3 organizations to develop and distribute materials about political candidates' positions on issues, in order to educate voters impartially and on a nonpartisan basis; meaning that it is free from party affiliation, bias, or designation. The IRS states that 501c3 organizations may conduct any range of activities to promote voter participation and educate voters so long as it is nonpartisan. But, 501c3 organizations are explicitly prohibited from supporting or opposing candidates for public office.

Some of the activities 501c3 nonprofits MAY perform: Conduct or promote voter registration; educate voters on the voting process; distribute nonpartisan sample ballots, candidate questionnaires, and **voter guides**; organize get-out-the-vote activities; encourage and help people to vote; educate the candidates on issues important to their organization; and continue to do issue advocacy during an election.

So, first and foremost: **Church Voter Guides** does NOT endorse or oppose any candidates for public office or any political party.

Second, all of our staff and volunteers are required to act in a nonpartisan manner when working for or representing the organization and the creation of the Voter Guide.

Third, we do not edit, revise, or editorialize candidate responses to our Questionnaire. We do not even correct typos. **Candidate answers are published verbatim**, ensuring that their responses accurately represent their positions and perspectives on these issues. We then simply share this information through the Voter Guide, and you decide whom you believe to be the best candidate.

To be fair and impartial, we reached out by email, text, and phone when determined necessary, to all registered candidates running for office throughout El Paso County for both County and State offices (except Regents and Board of Education, as they are all running unopposed), inviting them to answer our Questionnaire. Candidate information is presented in ballot order. If a Candidate did not respond at all, or did not choose to participate, or did not choose to respond to certain answers in the Questionnaire, then that is noted where applicable.

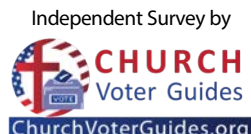

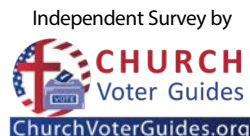
Your Experience: What experience (personal, professional, other) would you bring to your role as Congressperson that will benefit our state and nation?

Anything not explicitly detailed for the Federal Government to perform was left for the People and the States to handle as stated in the 10th Amendment. Power should not be concentrated to any one entity to ensure that proper checks and balances are maintained while protecting individual liberties for all.

As your next Congressman, I will fight hard to reduce the power and influence Washington D.C. has taken by returning it to the People and the States.

The government has no business forcing citizens to wear masks or take vaccines as a condition of employment, worship, or while engaging in any other legal activity.

As a State Representative, I've been fighting tooth and nail to stop the radical Democrats and RINO's from shutting down our communities.

There's nothing more egregious to our war fighters and American taxpayers than to see sell-out Republicans like Doug Lamborn voting for Joe Biden's 40-billion-dollar Ukraine boondoggle that barely harms Russia and does nothing to secure our own border that is being invaded from Mexico. Lamborn has proven once again he will sell us out to profit his establishment buddies at the expense of our own soldiers and taxpayers.

We need to stop laws that only favor a few and end the outrageous debt and inflationary spending that only helps the corrupt and harms the taxpayer.



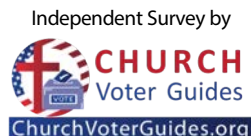

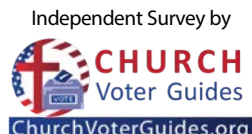

Congress has the authority to declare and fund a war, however the President has the authority over the Military as Commander and Chief. The President has taken us into conflicts but has not technically declared war. Congress' role is defined in the Constitution and should be adhered to. America should not be considered the police or piggy bank of the world. We have put our sovereignty and safety at risk while other countries sit idly by. It's past time for other countries to step up and take a more active role in conflicts within their global regions.

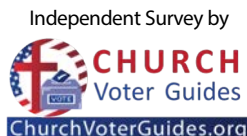

Federalism is an essential part of our government and without constitutionally guaranteed states' rights, all we would have is a very large, very overbearing federal government. I have always advocated for what our founding fathers visualized as a narrow scope of federal government, and a larger scope at the state level of government. My voting record strongly reflects this.

Federal Mandates: Under what circumstances, if any, do you believe that the Federal Government should use emergency powers/issue mandates, rather than submit the concerns to the legislative process? What are your positions regarding the Federal Mandates issued over the past two-plus years from both the White House and Governmental Agencies regarding COVID-19? Should Congress have done more to regulate such policies through legislation, rather than have them determined by the Executive Branch?

Since day one of the COVID 19 pandemic, I advocated for state and local government to have authority on emergency powers, mask mandates, and vaccines, rather than the federal government. But even state governors got carried away. I believe that business owners know best how to care for the customers and communities they serve. I believe the local school districts are closer to the people than state or federal governments.

Protecting the Most Vulnerable: As U.S. Congressperson, how would you seek to protect the most vulnerable in our nation, including the lives of the unborn, the trafficked, and the elderly?

As your Congressman, and prior as a state representative and state senator, I have fought to protect life, from conception to natural death. I have introduced and sponsored legislation that is 100% pro-life during my entire career as an elected official. Respected national groups, such as National Right to Life and Susan B. Anthony List, that rank pro-life votes, have always given me their highest possible ranking.

1st Amendment: What will you do as U.S. Congressperson to protect Americans' 1st Amendment rights to: the free exercise of religion, freedom of speech, peaceably assembly, and to petition the Government for a redress of grievances, all of which are becoming more difficult to exercise in America (and around the world)?

I have always fought to protect the 1st Amendment rights of American citizens. This includes fighting alongside members of our military, Jack at Masterpiece Cake Shoppe, and most recently, the owner of 303 Creative. I have been co-chairman of the Values Action Team which takes the lead in Congress on religious liberty and many other related issues.

2nd Amendment: Do you believe that gun ownership is a civil right, and what are your positions in regards to red flag laws, magazine capacity bans, legislation that regulates gun storage, and permitless "Constitutional carry"?

When it comes to defending the timeless principles of our nation's founding- the 2nd Amendment, I have not and will not waiver. I have never voted for legislation that would limit an American citizen's right to keep and bear arms. I have a "A" lifetime rating from the NRA and Gun Owners of America gave me an "A" rating in 2021.

Financial Policy: With U.S. debt now exceeding \$30 trillion and inflation around a 40-year high, what do you believe are the core problems with America's economic and monetary policy, and what will you seek to do as a U.S. Congressperson to correct them?

I will continue voting against the reckless spending packages and Washington pork-filled legislation. I continually support a balance budget, which we need desperately. When it comes to voting, I always ask 'where is the money coming from?' If it's from the pockets of my grandchildren through more debt, I am a NO vote. Citizens Against Government Waste as well as Americans for Prosperity have ranked me at 95% lifetime.

War Powers: Although the Constitution gives Congress the sole authority to declare war, this was last done 80 years ago, and since then the President has taken us to war. I do not believe the U.S. should play world policeman. However, I do believe that we should help our allies and partners defend themselves against unwarranted attacks. Strong partnerships such as NATO are vital. Russia and China are adversaries of the U.S., and it is in our best interest to assist those they are attacking, when possible. As Reagan said, "Peace through strength."

Corporate Power: Are you concerned with the level of power wielded by major corporations and their CEOs in America, including the dominant businesses in the crucial sectors of Technology, Pharmaceutical/Medical, Banking, Media, and Food Production and Distribution. What do you believe the Federal Government's role should be, if any, in limiting this power, while still supporting our nation's free market economy?

I am concerned that Big Business is becoming more "woke." I am especially concerned with social media companies, such as Twitter, Facebook, and YouTube, when they cancel or censor conservative thought. Being big is not wrong in and of itself, but using monopoly power to stifle competition must be addressed. I support a free market and less regulation, except when protecting safety and health, and enforcing contracts. The federal government should let the free market operate.

It is messy sometimes, but when government intervenes the resulting distortions create more problems than they solve. Lower taxes and less regulation make for more freedom and greater prosperity.



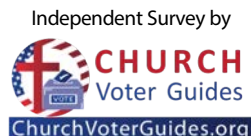

Your Experience: What experience (personal, professional, other) would you bring to your role as Congressperson that will benefit our state and nation?

I have spent my entire adult life in business. As CEO, I have witnessed firsthand how public policy can both facilitate economic development, or destroy it. Thanks to my own ventures across five continents, I've become quite adept at dealing with international economics and diplomacy. As a result, I'm intimately familiar with the extent of the financial turbulence across the globe. In my consulting work, I try to give governments and policy makers the civic and market tools they need to foster a stable and productive economy and provide environmentally sound methods of resource extraction. Now, I think our own country's politicians could benefit from that advice, and cannot stand by as their poor decisions continue to destroy our economy.



Your Vision: What is your vision for being our district's Congressperson?

My vision is simple, although I am aware of how difficult it is to implement in the D.C. culture. I want a return to a rational foreign policy where we cease our endless wars and constant foreign meddling. Instead, we should trade freely with everyone and be prepared to utterly devastate anyone who threatens us or our allies—without lengthy commitments to occupations.

I want to ensure our veterans are properly taken care of after their service and given the support they need to reintegrate into civilian life, especially regarding mental healthcare, which we have badly neglected.

I'd also like to rein in the profligate spending and loose monetary policy currently fueling inflation and lowering our standard of living.

States' Rights: Many Americans are concerned about the Federal government usurping power from the States. Do you believe that the current balance of power between Federal and State governments represents or deviates from our Founding Fathers' intent? As a U.S. Congressperson, how would you seek to protect Colorado's Constitutionally guaranteed states' rights (as well as that of the other 49 states)?

The federal government has massively overreached, but mostly due to bloated federal agencies. To remedy this, Congress should require that any new administrative regulation must expire unless ratified by the next session of Congress following its agency adoption.

A professor friend also provided the following rubric to evaluate new law:

1. Is it constitutional and properly federal?
2. Does it address an issue of dangerous instability?
3. Is it narrowly tailored to address only that issue while maximally preserving liberty otherwise?
4. Is it enforceable without being arbitrary or capricious?
5. Does it advance my core principles of individual liberty, private property and free markets, equal protection and the rule of law, fiscal responsibility, and the proper role of government?

Federal Mandates: Under what circumstances, if any, do you believe that the Federal Government should use emergency powers/issue mandates, rather than submit the concerns to the legislative process? What are your positions regarding the Federal Mandates issued over the past two-plus years from both the White House and Governmental Agencies regarding COVID-19? Should Congress have done more to regulate such policies through legislation, rather than have them determined by the Executive Branch?

The COVID-19 mandates were a constitutional disaster the courts are still trying to resolve. Unfortunately, our republic is deliberative, and not equipped for dealing with emergencies like a pandemic. Although I believe the COVID mandates issued by many governors and the feds were unwarranted and unconstitutional, they exposed the need for some protocol during emergencies. Executives may need to act swiftly during emergencies but, unless they do so backed by explicit legislation, any lower level government should be able to override such a mandate if, in their judgement, it does not serve the best interest of their local community. In this way, we allow for necessary emergency action, as well flexibility at local levels which know their communities best.

Protecting the Most Vulnerable: As U.S. Congressperson, how would you seek to protect the most vulnerable in our nation, including the lives of the unborn, the trafficked, and the elderly?

As the Supreme Court looks to be deciding, the lives of the unborn must be protected at the state level. However, the Congress can certainly ensure that federal funds are not used for abortions.

At the federal level, we can also greatly reduce both human and drug trafficking by securing our borders. Our current open border policy is the single biggest cause for the increase in drug and human trafficking in the U.S.

Finally, for the elderly at the federal level, we can focus our law enforcement efforts on fraud and deceptive practices. So much of federal crime represents regulatory issues benefiting tax collection, but doing little to protect the people. Redirecting our efforts in this way would help.

1st Amendment: What will you do as U.S. Congressperson to protect Americans' 1st Amendment rights to: the free exercise of religion, freedom of speech, peaceably assembly, and to petition the Government for a redress of grievances, all of which are becoming more difficult to exercise in America (and around the world)?

No rights are more fundamental to the American character and republic than those enshrined in the 1st Amendment. While it is primarily the role of the judicial branch to safeguard these rights, I will never support any effort to curtail the 1st Amendment in any way, and will work diligently to oppose or repeal any restriction on our 1st Amendment rights, no matter how well-intended. In our current controversy with social media, if the tech giants want to continue censoring our citizens, then I would vote to strip them of the legal protections that shield them from responsibility for all their content and treat them as any other publisher.

2nd Amendment: Do you believe that gun ownership is a civil right, and what are your positions in regards to red flag laws, magazine capacity bans, legislation that regulates gun storage, and permitless "Constitutional carry"?

Gun ownership is indeed a civil right as defined by the 2nd Amendment and explained by the Supreme Court in the Heller case. In that case, the Supreme Court already made clear that gun storage bills are unconstitutional. I oppose magazine capacity bans because they have no connection whatsoever to reducing gun violence. I also oppose red flag laws because they lack the evidentiary requirements needed to deprive someone of a fundamental right and are prone to severe and malicious abuse. I believe the courts will eventually overturn such laws as unconstitutional as well. Finally, Colorado has been an open carry state for as long as I can recall, and I rather like living here.

Financial Policy: With U.S. debt now exceeding \$30 trillion and inflation around a 40-year high, what do you believe are the core problems with America's economic and monetary policy, and what will you seek to do as a U.S. Congressperson to correct them?

If you include unfunded liabilities, total U.S. debt actually exceeds \$169 trillion. We are effectively insolvent. The problem is easy to see: we spend entirely too much. The solution is also easy, but much harder to achieve: we must stop. We must also publicly review the activities of the Federal Reserve, which continues to facilitate this atrocity as it quietly destroys our middle class and our standard of living. While I cannot do this alone, I pledge to use my position to expose these practices wherever I find them. Only daylight will expose these issues to the public, and only the public will be able to force Congress to rein in its spending.

War Powers: Although the Constitution gives Congress the sole authority to declare war, this was last done 80 years ago, and since then the President has taken us to war. What are your positions on America acting as "global policeman" and what Congress' role should be in international conflict, especially in light of the current Russia-Ukraine war, and our nation's tensions with Russia, China, Iran, North Korea, and other world powers?

We cannot afford to be the global police. Congress needs to stop funding endless foreign interventions. The \$40 billion Congress just authorized typifies this problem. Unlike the incumbent, I would have voted no. At a time when Americans are suffering from rampant inflation and hardship, it is irresponsible to spend money we do not have financing an undeclared proxy war where we have no legitimate national interest. I will never vote to entangle us in any engagement that is not in the direct interest of the U.S. and its allies. While I am appalled at Russia's actions, this conflict is not in our interest. It offers only severe risk to both our security and the value of the dollar.

Corporate Power: Are you concerned with the level of power wielded by major corporations and their CEOs in America, including the dominant businesses in the crucial sectors of Technology, Pharmaceutical/Medical, Banking, Media, and Food Production and Distribution. What do you believe the Federal Government's role should be, if any, in limiting this power, while still supporting our nation's free market economy?

These problems did not arise because of the free market, but due to the federal government's corruption of the free market. Our subsidies in the agricultural industry has created near monopolies. Our banks are so tied to the Fed and the government that they are more corporatist than capitalist. Our social media giants benefit from special government protections, while our big tech and pharma operate under such extensive regulations as to present incredible barriers to entry and competition. Such special favor is not the proper role of government. Although this is too vast to cover in 120 words, we could go a long way to solving this problem by stopping our subsidies, special exemptions, bailouts, and other special benefits.

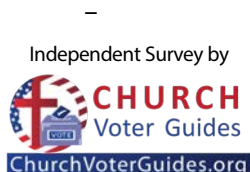

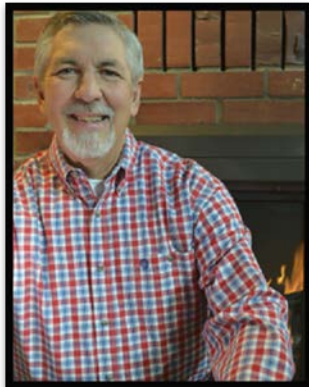

I have spoken out against executive orders, where I have no vote, but where the power of one man has deliberately and knowingly ignored the rights guaranteed in the 1st Amendment. I have signed onto bills that would limit the ability of any one person to wield that kind of power in the future. A state senator's authority stops at the state line, we have very little influence in a global sense.

2nd Amendment: Do you believe that gun ownership is a civil right, and what are your positions in regards to red flag laws, magazine capacity bans, legislation that regulates gun storage, and permitless "Constitutional carry"?

I have voted against every attempt to curtail our constitutional right to keep and bear arms that has come in front of the senate during my service, including the red flag law and storage bills that intrude inside your home. I would welcome the opportunity to implement Constitutional Carry in Colorado.

Government Authority: Do you believe that the government has the legal power and authority to dictate what a person does with his or her body? If so, how?

I do not believe the government has the legal power or authority to control what a person does with their own body. However, when what a person does with or to their own body threatens the life and wellbeing of another person, of any age, that is when the authority of the government is required to step in to provide protection to the innocent or the threatened.

Education: As a State Senator, what will you do to improve the education of our K - 12 students? What is your position on parental authority in education, including school choice?

I sponsored HB22-1236 THE PARENTS BILL OF RIGHTS. This bill clearly states the parent is responsible for medical decisions of their child and the school cannot perform them without parental consent. Also, the parent has the right to direct the education of their child with the same moral values that are taught at home. I care passionately about parents having choices in their children's education and exercised them with my own children. I will continue to support bills that put students first.

School District Taxes: Do you believe that the Colorado legislature should make any adjustment to the level of taxes paid by residents in order to fund school district budgets? If so, how?

Colorado is very much a local control state, and every local school district has a board that, through the ballot box – for at least the last 30 years - set the rate homeowners pay. Those school boards answer to the voters. So, the legislature has no authority in those matters. However, I do believe the legislature has a role in ensuring the taxes parents pay go to the school their child is attending.

National Popular Vote: What is your position on Colorado joining the National Popular Vote Interstate Compact, which would effectively eliminate the electoral college's role in presidential elections in favor of a national popular vote?

I voted against joining the National Popular Vote Interstate Compact and spoke against it on the floor. The National Popular Vote disenfranchises the voters of rural states. Something the founding fathers recognized would be the case when they adopted the Electoral College.

Your Experience: What experience (personal, professional, other) would you bring to your role as Senator that will benefit our state?

I'm a third generation Cheyenne County farmer/rancher, and have been active in agriculture my entire life. I have owned and operated successful businesses in addition to farming and ranching, including trucking and custom harvesting, so I know what it means to watch the "bottom line" of your finances. In addition, prior to becoming a State Representative, I served as Cheyenne County Commissioner for six years. This experience prepared me to be a better legislator, because I see things from the local/county perspective, as well as from the state perspective. Your Experience: What experience (personal, professional, other) would you bring to your role as Representative that will benefit our state?

I have significant experience testifying before state legislative committees and regulatory agencies. Most of my work over the past decade has been focused on statewide issues, such as co-leading the ballot initiative for a citizen’s repeal of the National Popular Vote in Colorado. During my 2-terms as a County Commissioner, I held various statewide leadership positions. My statewide work has enabled me to grow my grassroots network and develop relationships across the state with legislative, local government and state leaders. I currently operate my own small business (a law firm) with a practice focused primarily on local government law. I have extensive experience working with federal, state and local governments, as well as understanding many of the funding streams.

Your Vision: What is your vision for being a Colorado State Representative?

My vision is to consistently engage with my constituents to truly understand the issues that are important to them and hold stakeholder meetings and townhalls so that I communicate directly with the people I serve. Legislation does not happen in a vacuum so it is important to utilize my statewide relationships to get positive legislation that helps our community passed and to gain allies in fighting against harmful legislation. I will also be proactive in informing the grassroots community about opportunities for them to get involved and have their voices heard.

Election Reform: Do you believe that elections in Colorado should be conducted differently? Should voters in Colorado be required to verify their identity and residential status in the respective counties in which they vote? Are you in favor of a single-day, in-person voting system consisting of all-paper ballots? Why or why not?

I believe that voter identification, including the county of their residence, should be required to vote and am against ballot harvesting, as it opens the door to election fraud. I also believe that the voter rolls must be cleaned up so that they are accurate. I support giving people options to vote and allowing them to decide which option works best for them, including mail-in ballots and in-person voting, on paper ballots or on machines that generate paper ballots so people can confirm that their votes were recorded accurately.

TABOR: What is your position on the Taxpayers Bill of Rights (TABOR)?

I chose to live in Colorado because of the Taxpayers' Bill of Rights ("TABOR"). I thought any state that allowed their people to vote on tax increases was a free state. It is unfortunate that TABOR is currently being eroded and circumvented by the State Legislature. I have a proven record of fighting for TABOR and against fees disguised as taxes and tax increases.

Education: As a State Representative, what will you do to improve the education of our K - 12 students? What is your position on parental authority in education, including school choice?

As a State Representative, I would support vouchers and believe strongly that money should follow the child. As a mother of a child with special learning needs, I understand first-hand that one size does not fit all in education and I have a record that supports parents advocating for their children in education, parental rights in education and school choice.



Government Authority: Do you believe that the government has the legal power and authority to dictate what a person does with his or her body? If so, how?

I do not believe that the government has the legal power or authority to dictate what a person should do with their body and I support medical freedom. However, I am a devoted Catholic and Pro-Life so I do not support abortions or euthanasia.

Protecting the Most Vulnerable: As a Representative, how would you seek to protect the most vulnerable in our state, including the lives of the unborn, the trafficked, and the elderly?

As a State Representative, I would vote against abortion laws and the government funding of abortions. I worked for several years to raise awareness locally and statewide about the signs of human trafficking and worked on legislation to help victims, especially those in the child welfare system. I would advocate for resources for increased education and training on human trafficking for parents and our children to help teach them how to stay safe while on the internet. As an estate planning attorney, I have seen elder abuse, both financially and physically, and would look for opportunities to strengthen our current laws and protections for the elderly.

1st Amendment: What will you do as Colorado State Representative to protect our 1st Amendment rights to: the free exercise of religion, freedom of speech, peaceably assembly, and to petition the Government for a redress of grievances, all of which are becoming more difficult to exercise in America (and around the world)?

As a State Representative, I will always fight against censorship in all forms and protect our First Amendment rights. During the Covid- 19 pandemic, as a County Commissioner, I fought hard against closing churches and strongly advocated that they were essential. I worked to re-open churches as quickly as possible after the lock-down. Our re-open plan was the template statewide for re-opening businesses and churches, based on freedom; not force.

2nd Amendment: Do you believe that gun ownership is a civil right, and what are your positions in regards to red flag laws, magazine capacity bans, legislation that regulates gun storage, and permitless "Constitutional carry"?

Your Experience: What experience (personal, professional, other) would you bring to your role as Representative that will benefit our state?

When I left the military 20 years ago, I wanted to apply my USAF Academy management degree, my MBA, and 6 years of experience as an Air Force officer. I accepted a position in supply chain management at a large manufacturing plant, which required working with many stakeholders (suppliers, technicians, engineers, etc.) to understand the issues, risks, and improvement ideas before developing a plan. The lessons I learned applied to my career in defense contracting, with many opportunities to find win-win solutions in managing proposals, projects, subcontracts and contracts. I know they'll be just as useful to me as a legislator, where I'll keep my personal (and Academy class) motto in mind: "We'll find a way... or MAKE one!"



Your Vision: What is your vision for being a Colorado State Representative?

Because career politicians tend to create more problems than they solve, I intend to be a citizen statesman instead. As a long-term resident of Colorado Springs, I will represent the values of our community, only support legislation that is unquestionably Constitutional, and seek to limit government intervention in our lives and livelihoods rather than limiting Coloradans’ freedoms. Too many politicians say they'll uphold conservative values in order to get elected, but then they waffle and vote like liberals when they're in office. I'll keep my commitments, including THIS PROMISE: I will tell my constituents WHY I voted "YEA" or "NAY" on every single vote I make in the legislature.

Election Reform: Do you believe that elections in Colorado should be conducted differently? Should voters in Colorado be required to verify their identity and residential status in the respective counties in which they vote? Are you in favor of a single-day, in-person voting system consisting of all-paper ballots? Why or why not?

Because confidence in our elections is critical to our form of government, I support common sense measures such as requiring proof of citizenship to register to vote and a government-issued photo ID to request a ballot. County Clerks must be empowered and expected to remove from their voter rolls anyone who has died, moved away, or no longer wishes to vote. I am in favor of single-day, in-person voting and a State holiday for election day. Additionally, we should use auditable paper ballots in all cases, not paperless computer systems. And, if anyone is in doubt about the need to end ballot harvesting, I would recommend that they watch the documentary “2,000 Mules.”

TABOR: What is your position on the Taxpayers Bill of Rights (TABOR)?

I WILL defend the Taxpayer's Bill of Rights (TABOR), and work to eliminate dishonest legislative practices like the inappropriate use of the “safety clause” in far too many bills, and the labeling of taxes as “fees” to circumvent TABOR requirements. I support school boards, along with private & charter schools and home school parents, in directing their own curriculum, policies, and security; and I oppose State and federal mandates that impose things like sex education of 1st graders and Critical Race Theory (CRT). One of the first bills I co-sponsor will be legislation to fully fund Colorado's commitment to K-12 per pupil funding, by eliminating the so-called "Budget Stabilization" shortfall, commonly known by educators as the "B.S. factor." Your Experience: What experience (personal, professional, other) would you bring to your role as Representative that will benefit our state?

I currently serve you on City Council where I have a proven record of leadership. I have been married to my wife for 31 years and we have raised our children in House District 16. I served my country for 21 years in the Army - as a Special Forces NCO (Green Beret), in military intelligence, and as an Officer and Physician Assistant. I am an Iraq War Veteran. I understand what it means to put others before yourself.

I have been the Center Director of a Men’s Health Clinic and understand the challenges of small business.



Your Vision: What is your vision for being a Colorado State Representative?

Serve the People. That is my vision. Just like when I ran for city council - it isn't about me. Right now, too many of our elected officials think their job is to impose some kind of agenda on our citizens. That isn't their job. Their (my) essential job is to provide our citizens with excellent Public Safety, Infrastructure (think roads), and Public Schools - and not violate our constitution while doing it. It is not the government's job to weaken our police, ignore our roads, and try to undercut parents' values in our schools.

Election Reform: Do you believe that elections in Colorado should be conducted differently? Should voters in Colorado be required to verify their identity and residential status in the respective counties in which they vote? Are you in favor of a single-day, in-person voting system consisting of all-paper ballots? Why or why not?

Yes, elections in Colorado should be conducted differently. American citizens have to have confidence in their elections. Requiring voter ID and residential status is a no brainer. Try getting on a plane without ID. If a single-day, in-person voting system consisting of all-paper ballots is "doable" I would support it. The reason why is that it would restore confidence in our election results among our citizens who are skeptical about them. We would be able to address concerns about electronic manipulation of the vote. It would also end ballot harvesting.

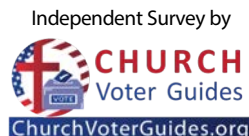
TABOR: What is your position on the Taxpayers Bill of Rights (TABOR)?

I support it. Our state government should not try to circumvent it by calling taxes fees.

Education: As a State Representative, what will you do to improve the education of our K - 12 students? What is your position on parental authority in education, including school choice?

I am a strong supporter of parental authority in education and school choice. My children attended Corpus Christi Elementary School, and then graduated from Vanguard Charter School or Saint Mary's High School.

Funding in schools needs to be shifted away from bloated school administrations and used to increase teacher salaries to attract more teachers and compensate them for the critical role they have in teaching our children. Divisive issues like CRT and sexual identity don't belong in our schools.



Government Authority: Do you believe that the government has the legal power and authority to dictate what a person does with his or her body? If so, how?

I think this question is about the COVID debacle we just went through. On the El Paso County Board of Health I led the fight against mandates and led the fight against a resolution “in support of voluntary COVID vaccinations”. It was a typical government, one size fits all solution (even after it was clear there were serious side effects, and it wasn’t effective at preventing infection). Mandating that citizens had to get that shot, even though they may have had antibodies, was and is wrong. If we can't decide what is injected into our bodies, are we really free?

Protecting the Most Vulnerable: As a Representative, how would you seek to protect the most vulnerable in our state, including the lives of the unborn, the trafficked, and the elderly?

On Colorado Springs City Council I successfully led the effort to enact a Massage Therapy Business License. I coordinated with our Colorado Springs Police Department (CSPD) Vice, Narcotics and Intelligence Unit, City Attorney Office, and City Clerk's office to craft an ordinance which will give us the ability to end the human trafficking and prostitution which has been occurring at Illicit Massage Parlors in our city for decades. The ordinance was approved 9-0 on two separate votes. It will begin to be enforced on 1 September 2022.

I am Pro-Life. I will be an ally for groups working for the protection of the unborn, the elderly, and the trafficked.

1st Amendment: What will you do as Colorado State Representative to protect our 1st Amendment rights to: the free exercise of religion, freedom of speech, peaceably assembly, and to petition the Government for a redress of grievances, all of which are becoming more difficult to exercise in America (and around the world)?

I will uphold the constitution. I didn’t serve 21 years in the Army, part of that time as a Green Beret, to be intimidated into giving up our constitutional rights. I will vote against anything which I think violates or undermines any of these rights. I will be proud to sponsor or support bills which promote these rights. I will speak out, as I did on the EPC Board of Health, when I think citizens rights are being violated.

2nd Amendment: Do you believe that gun ownership is a civil right, and what are your positions in regards to red flag laws, magazine capacity bans, legislation that regulates gun storage, and permitless "Constitutional carry"?

I am a NRA life member, concealed carry permit holder, member of a shooting club, former Green Beret and serve on the board of the Pikes Peak Firearms Coalition. Would you like to guess my position on 2A issues? The problem isn't law abiding citizens with 30- round magazines, it is criminals with any weapon - a knife, hammer, or gun. We need to stop reducing penalties for crimes, and punish criminals for breaking the law. Regulating gun storage turns honest citizens into criminals.

Infrastructure Spending: How do you believe that tax revenue in Colorado should be best utilized to improve our infrastructure?

When I ran for city council the top two priorities for me were public safety (police and fire), and infrastructure. There are only a few things that most citizens really want their government to focus on - but those are two of them. It is like focusing on blocking and tackling in football - the fundamentals bring success. We have to make infrastructure - roads, bridges, dams, airports, wastewater, etc. a top priority.

Currently our government is focused on too many other issues - like decreasing penalties for criminals, and trying to force cities, businesses and individuals to adopt green energy options. We have to stay focused on delivering the fundamentals.

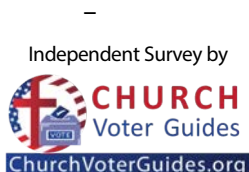

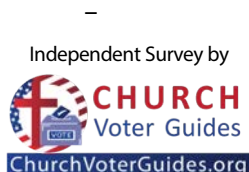

I support TABOR and the limitations it places on government.

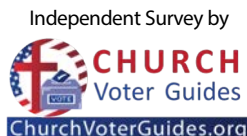

Your Experience: What experience (personal, professional, other) would you bring to your role as Representative that will benefit our state?

I have served the Town of Monument for 6 years now, 4 of them as Mayor. I have seen how state legislation affects our smaller communities often with one size fits all solutions. As one of two individuals that challenged the state legislator for the first time in over 80 years with a citizen's referendum against the National Popular Vote, I learned how out of touch some state legislators are and how their focus has moved from the local community to national hot topics. I serve on multiple legislative committees and have testified both for and against legislation on several occasions. With my experience at the local level, I believe I can help bring a Colorado focus to the state house again.

Recently in our community, I have had to defend our religious freedoms against out of state anti-Christian activist groups. We won this battle, but this is not the end. We need to continue to fight this kind of censorship and cancel culture.

The State agencies responsible for our infrastructure need to be refocused. Many of these agencies have lost touch with their designed purpose and spend too many taxpayer dollars outside their purview and on pet projects. New legislation needs to guide these agencies back to their core responsibilities.

Your Vision: What is your vision for being a Colorado State Representative?

To return the government to its “just powers” as derived “from the consent of the governed” for the purpose of securing our Creator endowed Rights per the founding values of our Republic. Our legislators have largely betrayed this as their focus. While democrats have been increasing government intrusion into all aspects of our social fabric, “republicans” have been (inadvertently) increasing the government collusion with business. Both can undermine our individual Liberty. Even seemingly well-intended bills often undermine our freedom to curry favors from a faction or special interest for power or money. Individual Liberty is surrendered through compromise with State Power, and may be difficult, if not impossible to regain.

Election Reform: Do you believe that elections in Colorado should be conducted differently? Should voters in Colorado be required to verify their identity and residential status in the respective counties in which they vote? Are you in favor of a single-day, in-person voting system consisting of all-paper ballots? Why or why not?

All computers can be hacked. Paper ballots limit the extent of inevitable tampering. Single-day voting with ID and paper ballots limits risk.

Computers do as programmed and are susceptible to corruption in their coding, which you are not allowed to see, and in their hardware, which is usually produced by countries hostile to our interests. Election manipulation is of high strategic value because it determines who will yield power and money. Hackable machines make our elections a soft target.

Accuracy is the primary characteristic required. Cost is irrelevant since it is not secure. Lack of confidence and transparency leads to lawsuits, audits, and ultimately hand-counting; electronic voting is expensive, and time intensive.

TABOR: What is your position on the Taxpayers Bill of Rights (TABOR)?

Support. TABOR should be strengthened by requiring all new spending be approved in the general election, and disallowing the use of the “peace, health or safety” clause to bypass referendum per Article V, Section 1, paragraph 3. Automatic inflation adjustment and annual percentage (exponential) growth should be banned. Program renewals should require 2/3 majority vote to proceed to the general election. Government has proved it cannot be trusted to act responsibly with the money it extracts now. Allowing the government to keep anything extra is further depriving the still functioning (but suffocated) free market of actually utilizing that money for good and worthwhile things that are best determined by those who earned that money.



Education: As a State Representative, what will you do to improve the education of our K - 12 students? What is your position on parental authority in education, including school choice?

Parental engagement and school choice are essential to education, as is local control of school boards. Vouchers incur State meddling, so tax credits might be more appropriate. The bloated bureaucracies of National and State education agencies have proven to be untrustworthy as they have become more interested in ideological indoctrination than functional education. They would be unnecessary with increased local control, so elimination would help reduce the 30-40% of the per-student cost that goes to administrivia, which would allow increasing the number of teachers. Free enterprise in education will increase and improve options for students while allowing teachers to be paid based on their efficacy.

Government Authority: Do you believe that the government has the legal power and authority to dictate what a person does with his or her body? If so, how?

Absolutely not. The only “just powers” of a government are those derived from the consent of the governed for the purpose of securing our entitled Rights. Government has no just authority to operate outside of those bounds. Government’s role is to secure our Rights by protecting them from infringement, not to impose compliance.

This subject becomes muddled where we ask the State to assume responsibility in areas such as healthcare. If we expect our fellow citizens to bear the load of our health, the taxpayers (by way of the government) have a vested interest in our health-related choices, and a responsibility to ensure those decisions are sound. Foisting our responsibilities on government necessitates the governments foisting of restrictions on us.

Protecting the Most Vulnerable: As a Representative, how would you seek to protect the most vulnerable in our state, including the lives of the unborn, the trafficked, and the elderly?

Our laws need to reflect the inherent value of every citizen as an image-bearer of God not as a balance of cost/benefit to the State. Laws violating our constitutional values must be rewritten or rescinded. It is within the “just powers” of the government to protect the Rights of citizens. Either all have the Right to Life, or none do. Life must be protected from conception to natural death. Feticide must be illegal. Euthanasia must be banned as well as schemes to assign negative value to healthcare for anyone over (eg) 75yo as proposed by the Biden administration.

Offending legislation must be repealed as anathema to our Constitution. Thought is shaped by speech, thus speech control is thought control. “He who dares not offend cannot be honest,” and without honesty problems cannot be solved. A society cannot function without the ability to solve problems. While some will engage in unnecessarily offensive speech, the restriction of that as an option is an invitation to tyranny.

Colorado’s Constitution forbids both preferential treatment and discrimination, but restricting someone’s speech to preclude offense is extending preferential treatment.

2nd Amendment: Do you believe that gun ownership is a civil right, and what are your positions in regards to red flag laws, magazine capacity bans, legislation that regulates gun storage, and permitless "Constitutional carry"?

“Shall not be infringed” shall not be ignored. The 2A is the means of preserving our Creator Endowed Rights. Liberty is impossible if dependent on another for security. Self-defense is a Right endowed to us by "the Laws of Nature, and Nature's God," as evidenced by animals defending both themselves and territory. Restricting self-defense creates subjugation or extinction. Guns deter aggressors. History teaches that after registration, guns will be confiscated, followed by tyranny. "No" on red flag laws, registration, magazine capacity bans or legislation on storage. "Yes" on constitutional carry.

Then, instead of shoe-stringing projects along with lowest bidders, a city can purchase the road or bridge with (eg) 10 yrs of maintenance. This would allow upgraded materials and processes upfront which would decrease maintenance later, decreasing time spent in construction delays. Discriminatory barriers to entry should be removed, but they should not be replaced with readily abused “social justice” edicts that do more harm than good and amount to nothing more than destructive redistributive schemes.

Your Experience: What experience (personal, professional, other) would you bring to your role as Commissioner that will benefit our county?

The treatment of El Paso County's elderly during the pandemic was not only horrific but stretched to the level of abuse. Families were locked out from seeing their loved ones in their final days. Generations of our county's citizens left unable to have contact with those they loved.

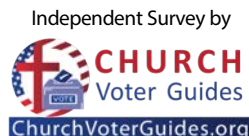

Your Experience: What experience (personal, professional, other) would you bring to your role as Commissioner that will benefit our county?

Elected as your El Paso County Commissioner in 2018 with 70.2% of the vote. I enjoy serving El Paso County citizens, advocating for District 1 residents, and supporting our military service members. I am pro-life, pro-family, support our right to keep and bear arms, and support our Constitution.

Your Vision: What is your vision for being one of our County Commissioners?

I will protect and enhance our quality of life by keeping taxes low, funding transportation, protecting private property rights, and supporting public safety.

I have fought for our conservative values at the local, state, and national levels including fighting for 2nd Amendment rights against Chicago Democrats, and taking positions on 26 bills – fighting for constitutional rights and against unfunded mandates and attacks on law enforcement.

I successfully fought for transportation projects including the Powers/Research intersection and for the Voyager Parkway/I-25 exit. I will advocate for funding to complete Powers North. El Paso County added \$13.1 million in permanent funding to roads and an additional \$24 million in one-time funding.

County Commissioner's Role: What are the roles, rights, and duties of an El Paso County Commissioner?

As a Commissioner, I take an oath to uphold the US and Colorado Constitution. My primary responsibility is to represent the citizens of my district and to ensure efficient use of taxpayer dollars. During the COVID emergency, I fought to open closed religious' institutions and opposed mask and vaccine mandates.

We consistently adopt a balanced budget that meets TABOR. I monitor state legislation that affects county services especially when it diminishes our ability to enforce the law, risks community safety, or creates an unfunded mandate. We also fund maintenance for 4,400 lane miles of roads in unincorporated areas.

Building and Development: Considering our limited water and energy resources, to what extent and in what manner should the County be encouraging building and development?

I support American energy independence and private property rights. I evaluate new developments based upon the El Paso Master Plan, the Water Master Plan, and the land development code. I support the 300-year water rule that requires new development to have 3x's more water availability than the State of Colorado requires. I support our special district policy limiting mill levy rates and our road impact fee.

I support state legislation that reduces regulations and support affordable and attainable housing. I oppose legislation that benefits trial lawyers at the expense of Coloradans seeking to buy homes.



Departmental Budgets: What is your experience in regard to understanding and managing large and complex departmental budgets?

As a Commissioner, I've continued to ensure that El Paso County has a balanced budget and the state's lowest cost per citizen. In 2021, County government cost each citizen \$306, the mill levy was 7.692 and the property tax per citizen was only \$73.04. The closest county to that is more than 50% higher at 12 mills.

We pride ourselves on excellent customer service with a limited budget. When Governor Polis shut down the State economy due to COVID in April 2020, many employees did not miss a day of work and all employees were working remotely within a week. Our productivity during this time frame increased.

TABOR: What is your position on The Taxpayer Bill of Rights (TABOR)?

I support the Taxpayer's Bill of Rights. I believe that limiting the growth of government as well as requiring voter approval for tax increases has placed El Paso County in a very good financial position as the economy starts to grow. I support limiting the growth of government and believe that tax increases require voter approval.

Improving County Services: If new resources became available, what single area of County services do you believe most needs additional funding. and what do you suggest that money be used for to improve the lives of El Paso County citizens?

Road maintenance. El Paso County maintains more than 4,400 lane miles of roads. During the Great Recession, El Paso Commissioners made the tough decision to cut funding to roads. With normal inflation and required increases in services, our roads continue to be underfunded. In the past four years, I have supported increasing the road maintenance budget by \$13.1 million in ongoing revenue.

This year, I supported dedicating \$24 million in one-time revenue for roads. I will continue to support additional ongoing revenues for roads as well as adding additional one-time revenues each year.

Enforcing Mandates: What is your position in regard to enforcing "mandates" issued by governmental or non- governmental officials or agencies? How will you use the power of your office as County Commissioner to defend the Constitutional rights of El Paso County citizens?

During the COVID emergency, El Paso Commissioners did not support or enforce a mask mandate and, by resolution, I specifically stated that I do not support vaccine mandates.

When the state overreached on COVID, I supported the effort to immediately open churches for worship service that had been unconstitutionally shut down by Governor Polis. When we received money from the federal government, we quickly dedicated amounts to help ensure critical services were provided and small businesses were protected.

Additional federal funding is being distributed with very specific guidelines so that businesses have equal opportunity to apply for these funds. When the federal government allowed relief funding for roads, I immediately supported dedicating the maximum amount to roads.

Protecting the Most Vulnerable: As a County Commissioner, how would you seek to protect the most vulnerable in our county, including the lives of the unborn, the trafficked, and the elderly?

I am pro-life and will protect the lives of the unborn. Because illicit massage parlors are frequently used by human traffickers, the City of Colorado Springs recently adopted an ordinance requiring all massage parlors to be licensed. I would like to pursue a similar ordinance for El Paso County. We have pursued several pieces of legislation to protect the elderly, including legislation requiring elder care facilities to allow for visitation by family members during pandemic circumstances. Finally, I support legislation to make the senior homestead exemption for property taxes portable so that seniors may easily downsize into a home in later years.

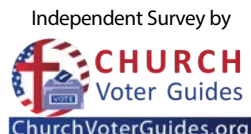
Building and Development: Considering our limited water and energy resources, to what extent and in what manner should the County be encouraging building and development?

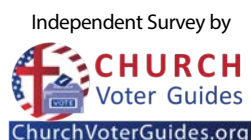

Your Experience: What experience (personal, professional, other) would you bring to your role as Clerk and Recorder that will benefit our county?

I hold a Bachelor of Science degree with concentrations in Marketing, Finance, and Business Administration, with MBA coursework focused in International Business. I spent a decade within the public and non-profit sectors as a Subject Matter Expert for the development, implementation, operation, and oversight of multi-million dollar local, regional, and statewide programs. Since relocating to Colorado I successfully launched entrepreneurial endeavors in finance and security technology and have served in long-term chief officer level roles for consulting clients across a wide variety of industries. I have served on numerous local, regional, and national boards and advisory committees for non-profit, education, and ministry organizations including currently serving in leadership for the Culture Impact Team at Church For All Nations.

Your Vision: What is your vision for being our county's Clerk and Recorder?

I am not a politician and had no intention of running for office but am tired of the same group of establishment people cycling through elected positions. Recycled elected officials have only lost freedoms and liberties, flaunted and disregarded laws, enforced government overreach and policies that do not serve We The People. Recycling candidates, supported and endorsed by the same organizations and other recycled candidates, has been to our detriment and resulted in elected office career building in government. I am in this race because without a truly conservative candidate option this office will suffer from career building versus statesman leadership. An entrepreneurial, outside the box attitude and mind-set focused on solid stewardship of our tax dollars is my vision.

Clerk and Recorder's Role: What are the roles, rights, and duties of the El Paso County Clerk and Recorder?

The role of a County Clerk & Recorder's office is to oversee elections, administrate DMV services, serve as clerk to the County Commission, manage recorded documents, issue marriage licenses, and provide other approved constituent services. State statutes provide the rights and responsibilities Clerks have regarding how to administrate their numerous roles. The duty of Clerks is to follow state and federal constitutions and laws with regard to performance of their roles, especially with regard to elections. It is the sworn duty of Clerks to oppose rules, orders, or mandates that are illegitimate or illegally instituted (by decree) by higher offices, such as the Secretary of State, in contradiction to state and federal constitutions and laws.

Operational Changes: How would you run the Clerk and Recorder's office differently from your predecessor?

While I am not granted access to the current day-to-day operations of the office, I can speak to potential changes based on constituent input. First, provide a less complex and more user-friendly public interface for internet-based information, searches, and services. Second, I would not authorize Clerk-collected taxpayer funds be given to other taxpayer funded entities. The current Clerk recently issued a press release celebrating the ongoing transfer of \$60K per year to fund new staff within a separate government entity struggling with funding and budget needs. I firmly believe in responsible stewardship of taxpayer funds and the return of excesses to We The People versus transferring monies to other government entities working to supplement their own struggling budget.

Election Integrity: Is the El Paso County Clerk and Recorder’s Election Department doing enough to ensure election integrity? If not, what are your proposals to secure our Colorado Elections?

Contrary to the narrative of election transparency, accuracy, and integrity given to the media, the reality has been the opposite. The current Clerk has followed illegitimate election orders and defended those actions at every opportunity. Private citizens and election integrity organizations have sought information and cooperation from the Clerk only to be rebuffed, given partial or misleading responses, or “smoke and mirrors” data. The situation is serious enough that the Republican canvassing judge was unwilling to certify the 2021 election results. A new and higher standard, diligently following state and federal constitutions and election laws, regardless of decrees from the Secretary of State, is what I will bring to the office. My opponent commits to more of the same.

Colorado Secretary of State: Do you believe that Colorado's current Secretary of State is facilitating or hindering the Clerk and Recorder’s performance of sworn duties?

The environment Clerks are working in is a threatening one. Clerks who follow state and federal laws regarding the maintenance and record keeping of ballots and election results are being pursued via criminal complaints for performing their sworn duties. The fact that Clerks are being threatened and forced by the Secretary of State to submit to unlawful rules and orders and are by proclamation forbidden from forensically auditing questionable findings within their jurisdiction is unacceptable. A pattern of pursuing Clerks and limiting their abilities to perform their sworn duties continues to spread across the state with additional unlawful rules and orders being regularly decreed in an attempt to place more restrictions on Clerks working to fulfill their sworn duties.

Satellite Offices: Given the population growth in Colorado Springs, what is your position on the number and operation of satellite offices that the Clerk and Recorder currently has in place?

Based on the current and projected growth patterns of El Paso County I believe we need to actively explore opportunities to economically partner with other municipal and/or county organizations, most of whom are already in expansion mode, to create satellite service centers that offer expanded reach to constituents. New service centers in the Monument, Falcon/Peyton, and Fountain geographic areas warrant study as an opportunity to improve accessibility to all services across the entirety of the Clerk & Recorder’s divisions, especially DMV services. As the largest county by population in Colorado, we need to move away from just a few centralized service centers within urban core areas when growth is primarily occurring in suburban and rural areas.

**Department Priorities: What are your priorities for the following departments: a. Recording
b. Motor Vehicles c. Election**

Recording: Eliminate or reduce non-statutory fees for both recording and retrieval of documents. Expand online access to searches and retrieval of all feasible document platforms to reduce constituent effort and expense in retrieval of documents.

Motor Vehicles: Eliminate or reduce non-statutory fees, many being merely repackaged local and state tax initiatives previously voted down by We The People. Work to decrease wait times and bring back in-person services that have been relegated to technology/internet-based interactions only.

Elections: Present election plans and budgets that call for the cancellation of all Dominion voting systems contracts in El Paso County and a return to in-person ballot delivery on election day, accompanied by photo ID, with hand counting at the precinct level.

The Motor Vehicle Department is responsible for the certification of Motor Vehicle Titles and Registrations and acts as a Division of the Colorado State Department of Revenue.

The Elections Department is responsible for conducting all Primary, General, and Special Elections for the County. The Department maintains the voter registration rolls and works with other municipalities to assist with their elections.

The Recording Department is responsible for recording, indexing, copying, and preserving permanent public documents.

Our Clerk to the Board attends and prepares agendas, maintains minutes, attests the Chair's signature, and preserves and catalogs the official records and documents of the Board.



Operational Changes: How would you run the Clerk and Recorder’s office differently from your predecessor?

Fewer than half of our citizens are confident that their vote will be counted correctly. Most say their ballot will not matter anyway because corporate interests dominate the political process.

Election Security, Integrity, Property Fraud, and Transparency will be my primary focus.

I bring the ability to query Assessor, Treasurer, Utilities, Realtor, and Coroner data to assist in the cleaning up of our voter rolls. I am the only candidate that can understand the queried data and make the necessary changes. Who owns the property, pays the property taxes, and pays the property utility bill? Is it a commercial, residential, multi-family, or mixed-use property? And who has passed away is vital information to update our voter rolls.

Election Integrity: Is the El Paso County Clerk and Recorder’s Election Department doing enough to ensure election integrity? If not, what are your proposals to secure our Colorado Elections?

Our Election Staff has worked tirelessly to ensure safeguards are in place to secure the integrity of the process. However, I do not believe there is a perfect Office or Department; and I will work on improving processes and staff knowledge.

I will implement an annual multi-layered forensic audit of all election hardware and software.

This audit shall comprise three separate audits performed by third-party auditors.

Each audit shall analyze the hacking vulnerability of election equipment software and hardware. Verification that malicious malware was not installed, a test to ensure that tabulators were not sending or receiving information over the internet, and confirmation that vote switching did not occur.

These results will be shared with our citizens.

Colorado Secretary of State: Do you believe that Colorado's current Secretary of State is facilitating or hindering the Clerk and Recorder's performance of sworn duties?

Our Secretary of State serves as the Chief Executive of an Office that oversees and administers many laws and rules. Colorado's business and commercial statutes for for-profit and nonprofit corporations. Colorado Election Code, Voter Registration Law, Campaign Finance Laws, Lobbyist Regulation, Colorado Charitable Solicitations Act, Bingo and Raffles Laws, and Notaries Public Laws.

Our current Secretary of State has issued emergency rules and continually oversteps the powers of the office, and has most certainly turned this office into a partisan and biased office, and is no longer a neutral and fair referee office for the citizens of Colorado. This office is not different from our Clerk, an impartial referee for all citizens.

Satellite Offices: Given the population growth in Colorado Springs, what is your position on the number and operation of satellite offices that the Clerk and Recorder currently has in place?

I am a strong proponent of smaller, more efficient, and more effective government. I will continue to push for processes that make things easier for our citizens.

As Assessor, I have saved working families in El Paso County time and money that have eliminated unneeded annual trips to the office, and I will do the same as the Clerk.

However, I also recognize that our citizens want a person to answer the phones and want to visit with an actual person to get their needs addressed.

So yes, I support satellite offices. In fact, and recently, I worked with our Sheriff to set up a new satellite office in Falcon, CO, at no additional tax burden to our taxpayers.

**Department Priorities: What are your priorities for the following departments: a. Recording
b. Motor Vehicles c. Election**

Our Clerk and Recorder's Office is the Ginzue Knife of local governance - it releases records, issues licenses, runs our local elections, and could probably cut through a tin can if you need it too.

Many of us visit the Clerk's Office every year for one thing or another. We all need to register our vehicles, renew our driver's licenses as veterans, request a copy of our DD214 or our Warranty Deed to our home, request a marriage or civil union license, and VOTE.

All of these departments are just as important as the others and will get the same attention and dedication from me as your Clerk & Recorder.

I have earned a Bachelor's Degree in Business Administration and an Associate's Degree in Electromechanical Engineering. Your Vision: What is your vision for being our County Treasurer?

The process works like this:

- A property owner neglects to pay his or her taxes.
- A waiting period initiates.
- The unpaid taxes are auctioned off at a tax lien sale. The highest bidder gets a lien against the property.
- The tax collector uses the money earned at the tax lien sale to compensate for unpaid back taxes.
- The homeowner has a period to pay back or cure the lien, plus interest, or face foreclosure.

Your Experience: What experience (personal, professional, other) would you bring to your role as Assessor that will benefit our county?

I hold the highest licensure in Colorado, Certified General, with 26 years of work in assessing property and mass appraisal for the El Paso County Assessor's Office. I have experience appraising vacant land, residential, and commercial properties with an emphasis on commercial land and single-family homes. In addition, I have expertise helping our community navigate the losses from massive fires, floods, and landslides by creating a system to prorate values (taxes) and ensure residential assessment rates are correctly applied for the years following the disaster.

Your Vision: What is your vision for being our county's Assessor?

My vision for being county assessor is the fair and equitable treatment of all property owners. This includes staff education and cross- training, objectivity in the determination of values, and unbiased decisions regarding appeals. This includes deference to property owners when there is any doubt about the accuracy of an assessed value. Last, but not least is I will continue to promote an attitude of good customer service advanced by the four assessors for whom I have worked. These are personal principles I have operated under; and I will ensure these principles are embraced by all who work in the Assessor's Office.

Assessor's Role: What are the roles, rights, and duties of the El Paso County Assessor?

The role of assessor is to discover, list, classify, and value property for the purpose of levying property taxes. The rights of the assessor are the ability to perform those duties as a representative of his or her county, without undue influence from special interests in other counties or unfunded mandates from the legislature. The duty of the assessor is to perform his or her role with objectivity and fairness to all constituents. This includes ensuring valuations comply with State Board of Equalization requirements, property records are accurate, and appeals are answered based on supportable data without any bias.

Senior Property Tax Exemption: To what extent (if any) do you support the senior property tax exemption, and if so, how would you amend it?

I voted for and whole-heartedly supported the senior homestead exemption. I support legislation to make the exemption portable, thus allowing seniors to move and take the exemption with them. This would allow homeowners to downsize, move from two-story to single level homes, and to transition to a property with no exterior maintenance depending upon one's individual needs. In addition, the exemption needs to be doubled to be consistent with two decades of market trends in housing prices. SB22-093 would have accomplished this; and I am at a loss to understand why three senators from the Denver area killed the bill in committee.

Property Reappraisal: What is your position on the current method for reappraisal of property in El Paso County, and would you like to see any changes?

The original Colorado Constitution created a system of property taxation based on equalization, which means a class of property is valued equally among all owners using the same methodology. I believe there is wisdom in the philosophy of Colorado’s ad valorem method, which more closely follows professional appraisal practice. Imagine the disparity between two tax bills for the same home on the same street, where one owner pays ten times the property tax amount over the other, which has happened in California due to Prop. 13. The value cap system also harms new buyers by creating even more limitation on purchasing power than already exists, because one must factor in the new tax that will be charged after the sale.

Mill Levy: While the Assessor’s Office does not establish the mill levy, can you explain how the mill levy is established?

Mill levies are established by taxing authorities such as the county, incorporated cities, school districts, and special districts. For tax entities that have not “de-tabored,” each representative board of a tax authority must set the mill levy according to TABOR revenue limitations. The levy will change based on the values certified by the assessor. Growth and new construction or, in the case of schools, student enrollment, allow for a limited increase in revenue. However, the mill levy cannot be set at a rate that would cause the revenue cap to be exceeded without voter approval. Large increases in assessed value may lead to a reduction in the mill levy to satisfy the requirements of TABOR.

TABOR: What is your position on The Taxpayer Bill of Rights (TABOR)?

I supported TABOR in 1992 and I continue to support it today. The ability of voters to have a say in the growth of government spending has strengthened the will of the people and restrained individual lawmaker’s special interest in causes that benefit only a few people. I also support the ability of a community to make their own choice to increase funding for their fire district or pass a school bond issue under TABOR. TABOR accomplishes additional reforms such as prohibiting a local district from imposing an income tax and allowing for the local exemption of business personal property.

Your Vision: What is your vision for being our county's Sheriff?

The sole purpose of government is the protection of our God-given rights. Thus, the primary focus of the sheriff (and all police agencies) must be the protection of citizens' rights. I will make the defense of the US Constitution the primary mission of the sheriff's office. The sheriff's office will be the premier peace keeping agency in the state using the US Constitution as the steering guidance for how the agency performs its duties. By ensuring the supremacy of the Constitution, the sheriff will promote the founders' vision of small and limited government, thus, providing freedom and liberty to the people while ensuring that criminal violators are arrested and handed over for prosecution.

Sheriff's Role: What are the roles, rights, and duties of the El Paso County Sheriff? Are there specific ways that have you seen law enforcement agencies abuse their authority that concern you, and how will you prevent that from happening in the El Paso County Sheriff Department?

The sheriff is the last line of defense for the protection of our constitutionally guaranteed freedoms from anyone who tries to infringe upon those rights. The sheriff can and must make the utmost priority of protecting our rights from all enemies foreign and domestic. The sheriff has the right and the authority to prevent anyone, no matter who they are or whom they work for, from abusing people's rights. The sheriff must use his authority to stop and if appropriate, charge any government employee who does this. Neither the state, nor the federal government is superior to the sheriff, because the sheriff's authority is derived from the people who elected him and government derives its authority from the people.

Protecting the Most Vulnerable: As Sheriff, how would you seek to protect the most vulnerable in our county, including the lives of the unborn, the trafficked, and the elderly?

Human trafficking is a plague. I will prioritize resources and efforts to target trafficking operations, rescue victims, and punish traffickers. I will use any assets available to me to accomplish this. Crimes against the elderly are disgusting and I will pursue those who do this. Crimes against children are despicable and I will tirelessly pursue anyone who harms a child. I fully support arming school staff and will gladly train those who elect to. I am an active shooter response instructor and will ensure that every deputy is trained and understands his/her duty in response to such an incident. If there is any way to bring charges for abortion, I will. I will protect those who can't protect themselves.

Governmental Overreach: How will you defend and protect the Constitutional rights of the people of El Paso County against any unconstitutional overreach by state or federal government? (For example: "No Knock Raids", "Red Flag Laws", and "Health Mandates".) In addition, how will you defend and protect El Paso County citizens against ANY unlawful act by any individual, governmental agent, foreign/international governmental body, or organization?

The sheriff can and must refuse to enforce any unconstitutional statute, order, mandate, or regulation. This is called nullification and is not dissimilar from The Doctrine Of The Lesser Magistrate. Red Flag laws are unconstitutional. Health mandates are unconstitutional and must not be enforced or obeyed. No Knock Raids must only be used when there is imminent danger to an innocent victim/hostage and then only if there is ample probable cause to believe that such a situation exists. Absent this very extreme set of circumstances, No Knock Raids should not be used. The sheriff must not only not participate in government overreach, he must take action against it when it occurs.

Immediate Challenges: What do you believe will be your most significant challenges as Sheriff of El Paso County? How will you address the overcrowding in the jail, illegal drug issues, and human trafficking in our county?

Retention and recruitment are immediate challenges that must be vigorously addressed. The department's mission is suffering because of the loss of manpower. Current employees must be retained before new hires can be sought. New and effective leadership will likely improve retention. Treat your employees right, and they won't leave. Morale is the commander's responsibility. COVID protocols have been the biggest contributor to jail overcrowding. I will end COVID protocols. Drug dealers will be arrested. Drug and human trafficking rings will be aggressively pursued and dismantled. I will use every tool available to me to find and dismantle these organizations. Drug dealers will be arrested. Illegal grows will similarly pursued.

Recruitment and Retention: How will you recruit and retain highly qualified talent in the Sheriff's Office? Do you plan to address the diminished police protection to the rural areas of El Paso County, and if so, how?

Ending corrosive workplace practices like cronyism and applying fair and equal standards (such as merit-based promotions) across the workforce will improve morale. Providing clear direction and expectations will also improve morale. Improving morale will improve retention and retention must precede recruitment of new hires. I will recruit former EPSO employees who left to other CO agencies as retention effort. When the current workforce is stabilized, I will place emphasis on recruitment of military members leaving active duty. I will streamline the HQ element to provide more available manpower for patrol. "Take home" vehicles for deputies who live in or near rural areas will provide more and better coverage.

Interdepartmental Cooperation: What will you do to work cooperatively with local Police Departments and other law enforcement agencies within El Paso County to provide better public safety?

All local police departments should have interagency agreements, which should clearly identify their relationships. Forming taskforces among the local departments will provide mutual aid and assistance and serve as force multipliers. A centralized/joint dispatch/communications center will also strengthen local cooperation. The sheriff can (and should) deputize other local departments. The relationships between state and federal agencies must be clearly and uncompromisingly defined to establish the fact that local agencies are always in charge. State and federal agencies should only serve in support roles to and only at the request of local agencies. They do not have freedom to operate unless granted permission by the sheriff.



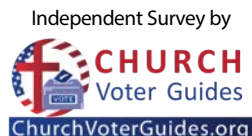

The duties and responsibilities of the Sheriff are set forth in Colorado Revised Statutes, which include keeping the peace and order in El Paso County, providing law enforcement services to unincorporated areas of the County, operating the El Paso County Jail to include the transportation of prisoners, maintaining civil process throughout the county, coordinating search and rescue efforts, and operating as the fire warden for the County, all while protecting the citizens' God-given Constitutional Rights. The Sheriff's Office also issues concealed handgun permits. I will establish a well-trained and well-educated workforce, knowledgeable not only in Colorado law, but also well-versed in Constitutional law, ensuring the citizens of El Paso County's rights and liberties are protected and never infringed upon.

In addition, how will you defend and protect El Paso County citizens against ANY unlawful act by any individual, governmental agent, foreign/international governmental body, or organization?

It is my duty, responsibility, and honor to defend the Constitutional rights of El Paso County citizens. As a respected leader, I will run the Sheriff's Office with strong and trusted relationships with our state and federal law enforcement partners. I will be consulted prior to the execution of no-knock raids that will only be used in the most extreme circumstances in order to preserve life and safety. I will not enforce red flag laws as the law was poorly written and is not needed. We already have a process in place for writing appropriate warrants to ensure citizens are safe and secure. As your Sheriff, I will not enforce health mandates that violate personal choice.

Immediate Challenges: What do you believe will be your most significant challenges as Sheriff of El Paso County? How will you address the overcrowding in the jail, illegal drug issues, and human trafficking in our county?

As your Sheriff, it is my responsibility to address the lawlessness and increasingly troubling drug use and crime in our community, which is at an unacceptable level. As your next Sheriff, I will not tolerate this as a way of life for El Paso County residents. Regarding our jail's population, I will ensure that we are housing the offenders that threaten the safety of our community and not using our jail to house the mentally ill. I will also promote education and reform to reduce recidivism. Human trafficking exists in our community, and I will partner with community resources to educate them about human trafficking activity to ensure the safety of the public and create an environment unwelcome to traffickers.

Your Experience: What experience (personal, professional, other) would you bring to your role as Sheriff that will benefit our county?

I have served the community and the Sheriff’s Office for over 26 years, and I am the Vice President of the Pikes Peak Firearms Coalition, protecting our 2nd Amendment rights. I began my career in 1995, graduating from (P.O.S.T) Peace Officer Standards and Training Academy. I have worked my way through the ranks starting at Sergeant, Lieutenant, Commander, Bureau Chief and Undersheriff. During my 26 years I have served in diverse capacities to include the Jail, Court and Transport, Internal Affairs, Intake and Release, the Special Response Team, Metro, Vice, Narcotics, and Intelligence while working with a Street Impact Team, and Marijuana Regulation, Concealed Handgun Permits, Training, Recruiting, and Budget and Finance.



Your Vision: What is your vision for being our county's Sheriff?

I will address the mental health crisis in our County both in the community and in the Jail by increasing efforts and programs proven effective. I will provide more protection for the innocent and consequences to offenders (Reduce victims and crime) through systems designed to prevent crime. Finally, I will continue to combat assaults on our constitutional rights and efforts to discredit and hinder our police forces.

Sheriff's Role: What are the roles, rights, and duties of the El Paso County Sheriff? Are there specific ways that have you seen law enforcement agencies abuse their authority that concern you, and how will you prevent that from happening in the El Paso County Sheriff Department?

The duties of Sheriff are to uphold the Constitution, operate the jail, serve civil/criminal warrants, coordinate search/rescue, act as Fire Warden and protect the citizens of El Paso County.

I will take swift action against corruption and abuse of power. I will prevent abuse of power by providing above standard training, clearly defining expectations, and create a culture which promotes transparency, accountability, and ownership of actions.

I will provide the community the opportunity to voice concerns through a solid complaint system. Complaints and misconduct will be investigated thoroughly and in some cases through an investigation conducted by an outside party.

Protecting the Most Vulnerable: As Sheriff, how would you seek to protect the most vulnerable in our county, including the lives of the unborn, the trafficked, and the elderly?

To make the biggest impact for our most vulnerable, we must impact the laws in order to provide statutory protection. I will begin with education and awareness, making the community aware of risks and threats and how to protect themselves. Working with legislators to introduce bills to protect our community will make the biggest and long lasting impact.

Your Experience: What experience (personal, professional, other) would you bring to your role as Coroner that will benefit our county?

I am a Board Certified Physician with 20 years experience and Co-Founder of Family Care Center, the fastest-growing comprehensive behavioral health care center in Colorado Springs. I also founded Direct Care, an evidence-based opioid addiction treatment clinic, and served an Army physician.

The incumbent coroner has shown that he is unqualified to help the public address the serious issues of opioid addiction, depression, anxiety, and suicidal thoughts that we see in our five clinics every day. Voters should trust that their coroner will NOT become an activist during a health crisis, pushing political agendas that harm businesses and children, while driving up suicide rates!

Integrity and leadership are essential.

I will never misclassify deaths for profits or politics.



Your Vision: What is your vision for being our County Coroner?

Integrity is the number one issue. Inflating COVID death numbers directly impacted public policy, giving the justification to lock us all down and take away our constitutional rights.

In addition to providing an environment that supports the hard working, qualified staff in the coroner's office, I look forward to empowering those staff members to fulfill their potential through peer leadership and open communication. One of the defining qualities of our business, Family Care Center, it taking care of our staff. We have a 92% retention rate for our providers. That is unheard of in the health care community. When our staff is supported, they can provide excellent care for those around them.

Challenges: What are the biggest challenges for the El Paso County Coroner and the Coroner's office, and how do you plan to address them moving forward?

The biggest challenge that we will face in The Office of The Coroner is to regain public trust. The public is aware that many deaths over the last 2 years were miss-classified as dying from COVID, rather that with COVID. Knowing that our public officials followed a political agenda rather than being a representative of 'We The People' will take time to repair, but it is a task we must and will accomplish. Additionally, there is a lack of transparency around factors contributing to deaths in our county, due to experimental injections, called vaccines, or treatments that are causing more harm than good. I will promptly address this issue.

Determining Cause of Death: How do you medically determine whether a disease or other condition is a cause of death, an unrelated factor present at death, or something in between?

Years of medical training and experience as well as a firm foundation in ethics, clearly leads to the conclusion that the determining cause of death is based in fact finding. Utilizing a PCR test, with an unacceptably high false positive rate, to determine cause of death, will lead to false conclusions. There have been multiple examples where someone has died in a car accident or due to a gunshot wound, but their death was attributed to COVID because of political motivation. I will return The Office of The Coroner to standards that we have come to expect from a public official. By reviewing the circumstance and medical history surrounding any untimely death, logical and truthful determination as to the cause of manner of death is unassailable.

Notifying Family: How do you communicate with family members when you have to notify them of the death of a loved one?

Compassion is essential when sharing the devastating news of the death of a loved one. Understanding the depths of their loss, even when families and friends can not yet fathom what the news of that death will mean to them in the days and months ahead, will help each individual manage a crisis situation as best as is possible under the circumstance. Simply being present in the moment and allowing each individual to receive the news of their loss with support makes all the difference. Kindness and compassion is needed to help those that are left behind continue on. It is our job to support those that remain here, caring for and serving our community.

Your Experience: What experience (personal, professional, other) would you bring to your role as Coroner that will benefit our county?

I am a fully licensed physician, board-certified in anatomic, clinical, and forensic pathology whose medical specialty is figuring how and why people die. I have performed nearly 5000 autopsies, supervised thousands of death investigations, testified in hundreds of criminal trials and have served as a medical examiner in this community for 14 years. As El Paso County Coroner, Chief Medical Examiner, and Medical Director of our forensic toxicology laboratory, I lead the busiest coroner’s office in the state, serving nearly 1/3 of Colorado counties, overseeing a team of death investigators, medical examiners, and toxicologists who are at the forefront of investigating the worst tragedies occurring in our community in hopes of preventing similar deaths in the future.



Your Vision: What is your vision for being our County Coroner?

The role of coroner is a challenging one. We serve our citizens and their families during the most tragic days of their lives. And in truth, there are no “good days” at the coroner’s office. But the information we gain through skillful and thorough death investigation provides our families, law enforcement, district attorney, health-care providers, public health department, elected officials, media, and citizens with the information necessary to improve the collective well-being and safety of our community. As El Paso County Coroner, my vision is to identify what has gone wrong, so we are best equipped to prevent those same tragedies from occurring in the days ahead through transparency and community-wide collaboration.

Challenges: What are the biggest challenges for the El Paso County Coroner and the Coroner's office, and how do you plan to address them moving forward?

The last decade has seen a startling increase in the “diseases of despair” that include chronic alcohol abuse, drug deaths, and suicide. This community experienced our own wave of youth suicides in recent past. And this was before a global pandemic disrupted our lives and support systems. As deaths of nearly every category have increased and the pipeline of physicians and investigators with the necessary specialty training fail to meet demand, adequate staffing is our most immediate challenge. Our office has overcome these challenges in the past by recruiting mission-driven individuals that desire to be at the forefront of our efforts to save lives through prevention as we’ve done with our recent teen suicide prevention success.

Determining Cause of Death: How do you medically determine whether a disease or other condition is a cause of death, an unrelated factor present at death, or something in between?

The statutory responsibility of the coroner is to determine cause and manner of death. This is done through a combination of autopsy and laboratory studies, death scene investigation, and a review of the decedent’s medical, social, and psychiatric history. In some cases, the cause of death may be clear, while in others it may require expert levels of forensic and medical training to decipher. The cause of death may have many factors, both natural and/or injurious. The “but-for principle” determines what injuries or diseases caused death... meaning that but-for these events, diseases, or injuries, the individual would not have died at this time and place, thus identifying the specific cause or contributors to death.

Notifying Family: How do you communicate with family members when you have to notify them of the death of a loved one?

Notifying families of the death of a loved-one is the most emotionally difficult but meaningful responsibility of the coroner. Once identified, our death investigators work with law enforcement to locate next-of-kin. Attempts will be made to notify them in-person as soon as possible but in the age of social media and families spread across the country this often proves challenging. With active-duty military members we work with mortuary affairs to perform notifications. After autopsy, our medical examiners, including myself, speak with families to relay the findings and cause of death. Our staff is available 24-hours a day to assist families in the care of their loved ones after death.


